## Timor-Leste's Ambassador to the US to be accredited to Canada and Mexico

The Ambassador of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste to the United States will soon be accredited to Canada and Mexico.

The Government of Mexico and Canada have accepted Agreement for Timor-Leste's Ambassador in the US, H.E. Constancio Pinto as Ambassador designate to both countries.

Pending presentation of the letters of credence, Ambassador Pinto will be the first Timor-Leste's Ambassador to be concurrently accredited to Mexico and Canada with residence in Washington, D.C.

Timor-Leste (East Timor) has called for Royal Dutch Shell to be excluded from discussions about the development of the Greater Sunrise gas field, claiming its promotion of floating liquefied natural gas technology represents a conflict of interest.

#### Timor-Leste at g7+ Ministerial Meeting of Monrovia, Liberia

Leaders from fragile and conflict affected countries have held a meeting in Monrovia, Liberia to discuss various issues with a view to achieve a one voice on Peace Building and State Building. The g7+ meeting was co-chaired by the Timor-Leste's Minister of Finance, Emília Pires, and the Minister of Planning and Economic Affairs of Liberia, Amara Konneh. During the meeting, the leaders of g7+ also has agreed on what is known as "Monrovia Roadmap on Peacebuilding and Statebuilding" which incorporates common interests that include: legitimate politics, security, jobs for all, access to justice and manage resources well. ### August Pacific crude, condensate exports stable vs. July

"Crude and condensate exports from Australia, Papua New Guinea and East Timor are expected to remain stable or rise slightly in August from the previous month, traders said on Tuesday. Supply remained below the usual 22 to 28 lots the region exports each month as a restart of Cossack production has been delayed while Van Gogh supply is limited. A total of 17-18 cargoes will be available for August loading, up from 17 in July [...]". For details please see <a href="here">here</a>.
